

E-WASTE MANAGEMENT POLICY

Objectives:

E-waste can generally be defined as any electrically powered appliance that has reached its end of life. Electronic waste or E-waste is generated when electronic and electrical equipment become unfit for their originally intended use or have crossed the expiration date. An audit to analyse whether the e-waste generated is channelled through an authorised producer, dismantler, or recycler. The primary objectives are,

- ☐ Minimizing e-waste generation in the campus.
- ☐ Ensuring safe handling and storage of electronic wastes in the campus.
- ☐ E-waste management is carried out under the System Admin to monitor e-waste generation and its safe disposal.
- ☐ Sensitizing the stakeholders on careful usage of electronic items in the campus and their safety disposal.
- ☐ Creating a clean environment both in the computer lab and in the campus.

Roles & Responsibilities:

- ☐ Identifying the e-waste generated in the institution.
- ☐ Ensuring the collection of e-waste and keep in an appropriate storage place every semester.
- ☐ Informing both the Management and the Principal about the generation of e-waste in campus.
- ☐ The institution endeavours to ensure environmental conservation and protection from the polluting effects of e-waste.

Waste Collection:

Our college has developed an internal standard procedure for the collection and proper recycling of e-waste, abiding by all aspects of the new rules. An e-waste signed company collects all e-waste disposals such as computers and peripherals, Monitors, desktops, laptops, printers, photocopiers, servers, landline phones, electronic components, network equipment, scanners, faxes, mobile phones, switching gears, projectors, electronic games, joysticks, cameras, DVD players, TVs, speakers, sound equipment, medical equipment, lab equipment etc.
